Creating Robust Regional Economic Benefits

CPV Valley Energy Center has received its approvals and is moving into construction. Watch for the significant economic benefits it brings to the region.



Economic Activity – CPV Valley is projected to provide a \$1 billion economic boost to the local economy (\$540 million during construction, plus \$463 million over 20 years of operation). These economic benefits reach into all corners of the economy.



Job Creation – CPV Valley will create over 500 new construction jobs (direct) at the peak of construction during two-and-a-half years of construction and 25 new (direct) jobs once operational. The project will also create additional (indirect) jobs needed to support the construction and operation of project. The total job creation (direct and indirect) is estimated to be 2,922 jobs for construction and 94 jobs for operations.



New Revenue Sources – The \$41 million in payments from the CPV Project will be additional revenue for the town, city, county, state and local school budgets, which can help stabilize local taxes.



Enhanced Regional Reliability – Continued growth within the lower Hudson Valley depends on reliable sources of energy. The CPV Valley Energy Center positions the region to attract and retain top tier businesses as the county develops.



Lower Electric Rates – Adding CPV Valley's electric generating capacity into the new capacity zone will help to reduce wholesale electricity prices.
